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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Devotees,

Compliments of the season!

I came on board as a trustee in 2005. Since then I have been enlightened about the operations of the temple, the coastal Bend Indian community and more so about what it takes to run this temple which is a place for devotees for faith, salvation, hope and prayers.

Two years ago, I had the honor to preside over the Board of Trustees. I am humbled by the support given to me by the trustees and devotees. I know that I could never take such responsibility without your support. Throughout my role as a trustee and now President, I have seen how God allots different roles for devotees to play to make various functions of the temple successful. My sincere thanks to all the prasadam donors. Especially the Mahila Mandal who has always been there in the time of need. Also, sincere thanks to the decorators who have decked up the temple through various festivals. And above all, our Priest Anikepalli, in the last few months, after departure of Priest Chandrashekhar has singlehandedly performed the duties of the temple with great devotion and dedication. We eagerly await the arrival of the new priest.

The recent Diwali function saw another success where we raised the target of \$ 35,000 thanks to the donors. We had approximately 950 devotees attend the function. Our next fundraiser will be the Festival of India 2016. We all know that funds are needed to run the temple. We have a good size Indian Community and I feel that we can afford this temple. In the last two years, a few important projects have been accomplished. We have a new driveway which has been especially built to facilitate devotees who have physical challenges to walk to the temple. We have refinanced our loan and reduced it from over 1 million dollar to \$ 950,000 with no early payment penalty. We plan to pay at least \$10,000 to \$ 15,000 per year towards the principle in addition to the regular mortgage. We have repaired and added more security lights. The temple website has been more active now than before, the temple's facebook page has been added and the quarterly newsletter has been revived.

The Board of Trustees have three priority goals: 1. Repay the Temple loan of \$ 950,000 as soon as possible. 2. Build a dining hall for the temple that we can maintain well. 3. Build the Rajgopuram for the temple. Our community is growing in the coastal Bend. The goals are within our reach. May be if every devotee family donates 1%-5% of their gross income to the temple, it will be financially sound.

Remember, the temple instills in us conscience, faith, a sense of belonging, security, culture, pride that contributes to our strength and character which takes us a long way. Encourage your children to visit the temple, make it a routine every week.

My Namaskar to you all and I welcome Dr Vijay Bindingnavale to carry on the torch of leadership. Let us all give him our full support.

DAKSHINA

In the ancient ages anyone that needed education, had to follow a GURU. The student went with the GURU, lived with him, served hand and foot with utmost respect and learnt all forms of education by observing and listening to the Teacher. No books to read and nothing to write. Education was in all forms that prepared the student to master the Vedas, worldly knowledge, using weapons etc. When the education is completed, the GURU never asked for something in return (one exception, Drona to Ekalavya). The student gave GURU DAKSHINA in some form or other. It would be a great honor to GURU when SISHYA, the student exceeded the teacher's expectations by absolute devotion and commitment to the highest standards set by the GURU who is always respected as a composite of Brahma, Vishnu and Siva.

In modern age such GURUKULAMS don't exist. We do consider one as a GURU in a certain way, the Priest. Priests are direct link between Devotees and GODS and GODESSES we worship. They have learnt Vedas and Mantras that are chanted in Worship. Before any Pooja, the priest sets up the devotees performing and himself as the medium through which the prayers are performed until final Mangalam is performed and TEERTHA PRASADAS are delivered.

The tradition is to offer DAKSHINA and DAANAMS of different kind, Suvarna Daanam, Bhoodaanam, Go-Daanam and such. As far as our regular Poojaas are concerned, we offer Dakshina to the Priest. There is no specific Prescribed amount. All depends on the satisfaction and affordability on the part of devotee. This is the the tricky part. This is where human nature plays big role, both devotee and priest being humans, neither of whom should be greedy or stingy. Devotee needs to respect Priest's talent to take Devotee's prayer to the Almighty to Devotee's satisfaction and reward with appropriate Dakshina. Priest needs to understand that Devotee's have different approaches towards this offering and treat everyone same way regardless of one giving big amount and one giving not so big. Onus is on us not to put Priest in a situation to give at least a minimum and on the priest not to put any pressure on Devotees to match their personal expectations.
